## **Introduction**

The New Education Policy 2023 is based on 4 main pillars access, equity, quality and accountability. Adult education refers to educational activities and programs designed for adults who want to continue learning and acquiring new skills outside of the traditional school or college setting. It is aimed at individuals who may have missed out on formal education or who wish to further develop their knowledge and skills for personal or professional reasons.

## **Goal of New Education Policy**

The primary goal of the Government of India in updating the New National Education Policy is to transform India into a global knowledge superpower. Access, equity, quality, and accountability are the four fundamental pillars of the New Education Policy 2023. The structure will be 5 + 3 + 3 + 4, with 12 years of schooling and 3 years of Anganwadi / pre- schooling. The new school and college education system will be more flexible, holistic, and multidisciplinary.

## **Main Features of National Education Policy**

By 2025, a new education policy is going to concentrate on basic reading and mathematical skills. Instead of every academic year, pupils will be taking only tests in the second, fifth, and eighth grades. Board exams for the 10th and 12th grades will continue. However, it will be redesigned. The examination will be held twice per year and will consist of two sections, one objective and one descriptive. Coding will be introduced to kids in grade six, and creative education will be used.
